





Yes! On the last day of preparation Whether at school or not Again will arrive the old rhythms But now from an overwhelmed heart.






## TOP SHOWER THOUGHTS I HAD THIS WEEK:


- # Plants are really farming us, giving us oxygen until we eventually expire and give them carbon dioxide.



## **TECHNOSCOPE**

Although technology does provide many positive benefits for learning, it also can have several negative effects on child development and quality of life.
