The importance and significance of the middle school was given by the headmistress of Middle school. The key points which were discussed by the headmistress of Middle school were the importance of teaching methodology, teaching aids, classwork correction, doubt clarification, internal assessment and many aspects related to middle schooling. The difference between the education today and education in olden days were well quoted and well explained by our principal mam.

The drastic changes that occur in today's education world were discussed by our principal mam asking the teachers to be more professional, more innovative, more responsible, more conscious and to love yourselves to grow more professionally in this blessed profession. ## RESOURCE CENTRES - THE GATEWAY TO SUCCESS


### **MATH LAB:**

Upgrade their knowledge on the basic fundamental principles of English as a language.







- To view the various posters exhibiting the different models of trains.



